Each challenge (test of a scientific principle) presented explains the science behind how it works in easy-to-understand language. The author is quite good at making complex explanations, simple. This is a relatively old paperback. The cover is creative and colorful, but the contents are all black and white, so a bit dreary in that respect. The font is extremely small, which means a lot of material (text) on each page, but most of them are broken up black and white sketches, showing what the challenge should look like, (set up, execution) and often is humorous, another inviting aspect to get kids to read the book.1 of 1 people found the following review helpful.
