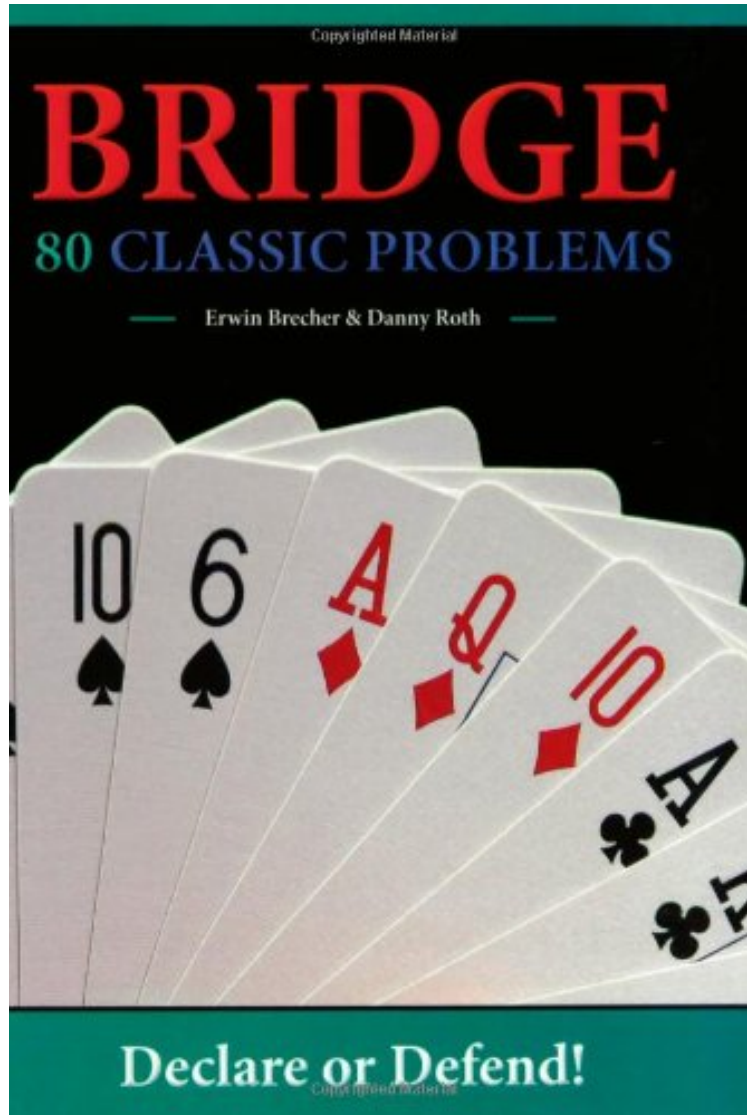

Terrible for KindleBy Mike SydlaskeElectronic books of problems solutions can be done well in two ways - (1) each solution immediately follows its problem, or (2) there are links that carry you from problem to solution and back to problem. This book instead has a Problem section, followed by a Solution section with no electronic links. This sort of format is fine for a physical book, but is really awkward for an electronic book.A less annoying Kindle flaw, at least as displayed on my Windows PC, is that the suit icons are

missing and all that shows is a box. So if West has two 7's and leads one, you must guess or figure out which one it was. The problems themselves are OK, mainly intermediate level. (This means I can solve most of them.) If you like bridge and play a lot, you probably won't be greatly challenged, but you might be entertained if you have nothing better to do. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. Good Problems, Mediocre Electronic Translation By Richard Dillman The puzzles made me think, and in time I was able to figure most of them out. The book was worth the price in that regard. I have the electronic version ... I bought it for use on my iPad in situations where I don't want to carry a book (or bunch of books). The puzzles are nicely laid out in this version, one per page ... but the links to the solution pages don't work at all. And if you go find the solution to a puzzle, there is no link back. In the end I had to bookmark the current puzzle, go read the solution, then use the bookmark to return, then close the bookmark. This is annoying and shouldn't be necessary -- each problem has a link marked "solution" ... but those links don't activate. 1 of 1 people found the following review helpful. like "The lead is the 4%" By Matthew H. Williams The Kindle version of this is completely unusable. Why? The symbols for spades, hearts, diamonds, and clubs do not "translate" to the written page. So you are left with an incomprehensible symbol, like "The lead is the 4%", and must guess what it is. Utterly useless.

There are two sides to every argument, yet most books on bridge concentrate on declarer play, opening leads, or defense. Very few books feature both declarer and defender problems, making this book uniquely interesting and useful book for any player wanting to challenge their bridge-playing knowledge or improve their game. There are 100 taxing bridge puzzles, all with full commentary and comprehensive answers and explanation.
