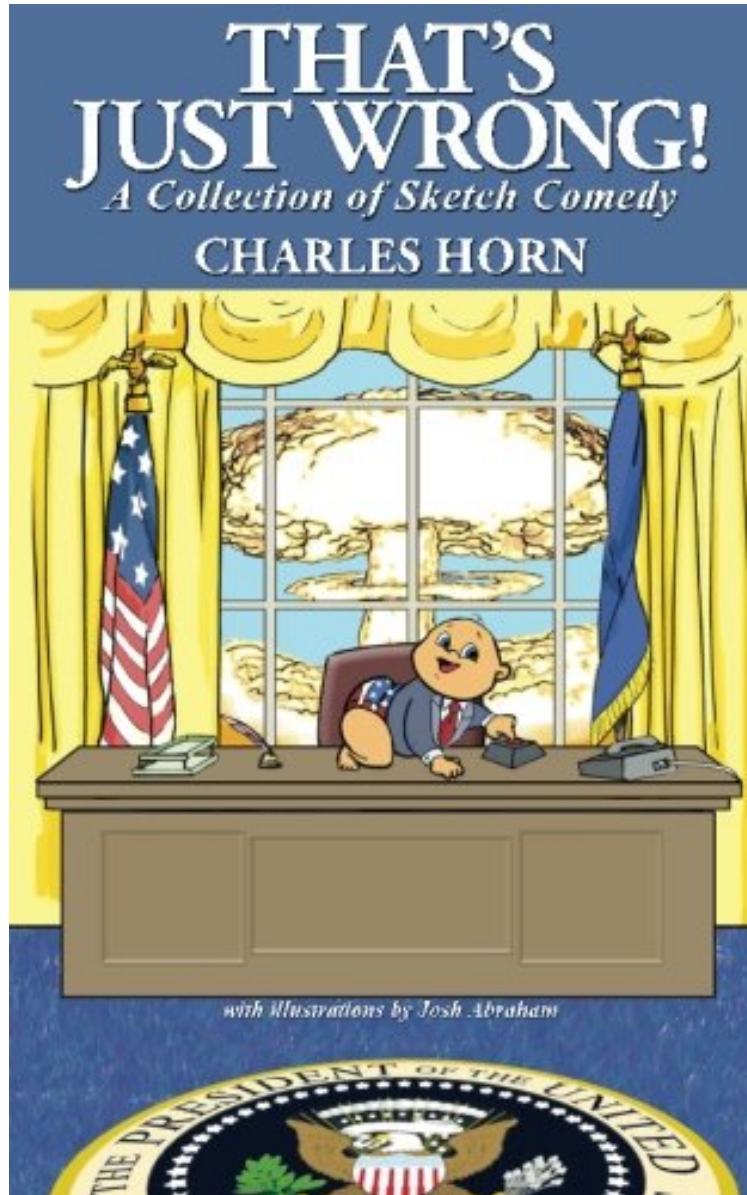

not an actor, I am more familiar with reading prose, so reading the sketches required a small adjustment on my part. But it was a quick adjustment, and definitely worth it! The sketches are very funny! I also enjoyed the colorful animated illustrations. Seven sketches are included in the book, and all of them are very funny, politically incorrect subjects. The "Behind The Sketches" [sic] section was interesting, providing quite a bit of insight on the stories behind the stories. The section also included tips for staging the sketches. It was in this section that I learned about the YouTube version of "Dish Come Home." I watched the animated version, but admit the skit was funnier when it played out in my imagination.
