There's some things to help you, but it's just not geared toward you, and it's kind of lame of them not to make that clear to someone looking for the right book. Also, I had a professor in college, really esteemed, Oscar winner, but instead of teaching us, he only ever just read from his memoirs. There's a little bit of that in here - digressions that feel more about like "here's who I've worked with" instead of sticking to the main point. For example, in one chapter where the author says she will talk about alternative funding channels, she ends up talking about what makes a good documentary interview with a filmmaker she gave a grant to. I'm about to mount a low budget feature, and I thought the book might provide good info on investment schemes and methods of raising money and other non-monetary support for a fictional project. However, this book is aimed at the non-profit and/or documentary filmmaker with only cursory references to fictional feature (or short) projects. I really learned nothing new from this title and I feel the description here is misleading. I suggest those of you looking for insight on funding for-profit films look elsewhere. If you are wanting to shoot a documentary then this book could be very helpful. My two cents worth.

The Art of Film Funding is written for documentaries, shorts, and feature producers for funding via grants, individual investments/donations, online crowdfunding, and distribution through streaming video. It is a comprehensive book covering both established financing to new online financing written by a woman who gives three grants a year valued at \$100,000.00.

About the AuthorCarole Lee Dean gives three film grants a year valued at more than \$100,000 and is operating President of a nonprofit company now partnered with Indiegogo for fiscal sponsorship for crowdfunding. She is well versed in creating and marketing online campaigns. While running a successful film and tape business in NYC, Los Angeles, and Chicago for 33 years, she created 130 episodes of HealthStyles and Filmmakers, now housed in the National Archives. She coined the phrase short ends when she created this \$50 million per-year industry. She was instrumental in the emergence of the independent filmmaker by selling new rolls and ends-of-film at reduced prices to emerging filmmakers like John Cassavetes. She travels worldwide, devoting her time to writing, creating grants, and supporting filmmakers.
