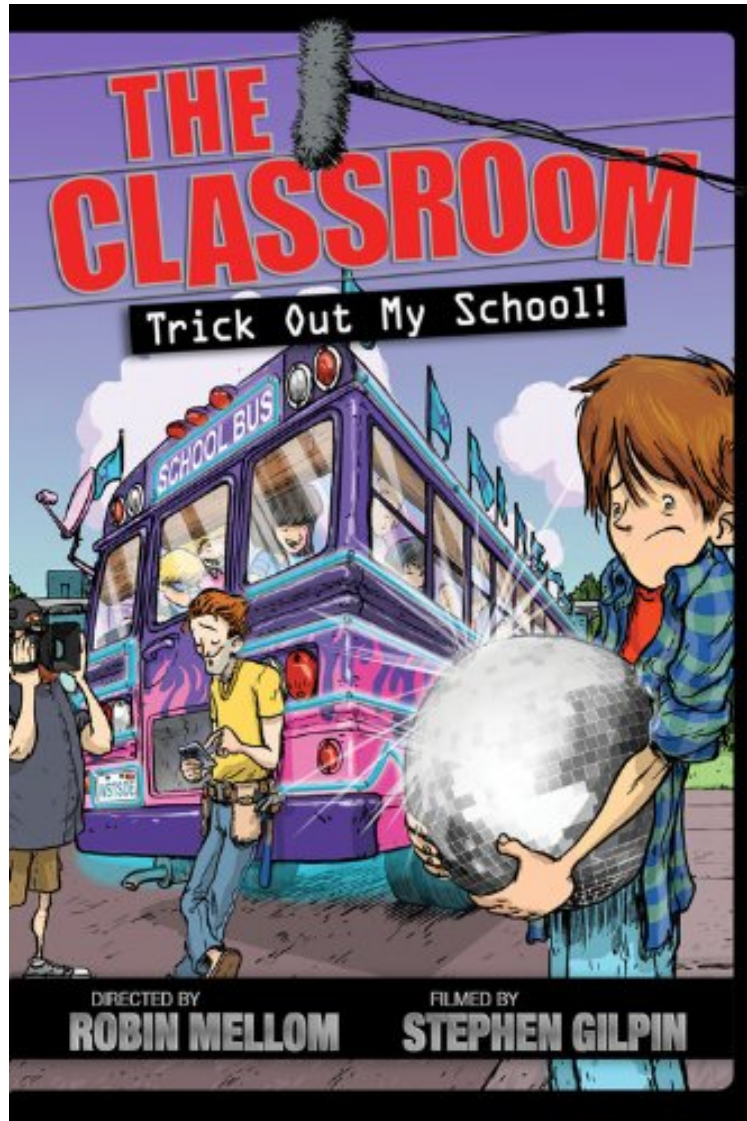

Each character was so carefully developed by Mellom that we got an up close and personal look into what made each character tick. This third book in the series has a different tone. Because the characters were so strongly

developed in the previous books, the reader immediately knows what they are like just at the mention of their name in Book 3. This allows Mellom the freedom to devote her talents to plot development by letting her strong characters do the work for her. Again, there is surprise after surprise and many laugh out loud moments; however, this book is edgier than the previous two. The plot is clear and well developed from beginning to end. The secondary characters seem to be hanging in the background, yet the reader senses somehow each will emerge in their own unique way as the plot develops. And Mellom does not disappoint!
