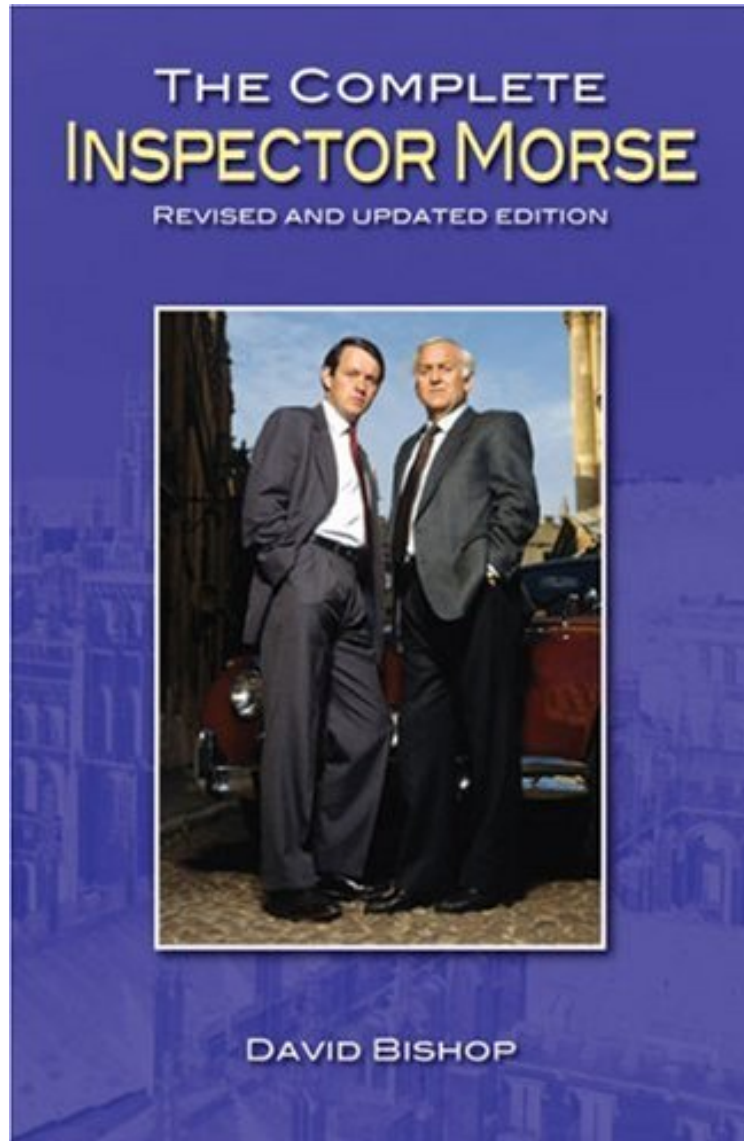

The author provides details of each plot, compares it to the book if appropriate, with comments on the hero's luck with the ladies, his

drinking, crossword puzzle solving, the classical music he listens to, connected books on Oxford, etc, etc. The book ends with the first episode of Lewis so maybe another updated version is in the future with all of that inspector's 33 episodes plus Endeavour.
