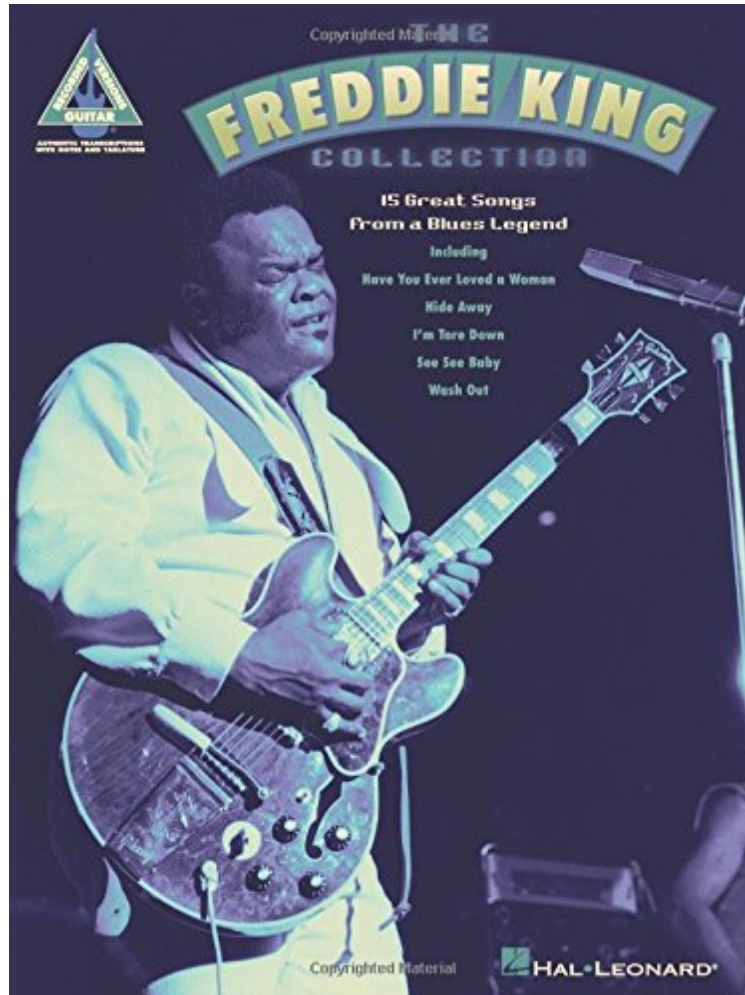

own, but...Freddie King tragically died too young, but by many accounts was more creative and virtuosic than the other blues greats like B.B. and Albert. Clapton revered and only tried to emulate Freddie. One of the things I like the most about Freddie is that he wasn't just blues, a lot of his stuff was very rockin and also had a strong Texas and Country electric blues thing going. If you want to be a serious rock and roll guitarist (as apposed to the whiny grunge that passes for rock these days for the younger crowd), I would recommend equal parts Keith Richards, Chuck Berry, and Freddie King. As for the book, I've been living with 5 of the tabs for quite a few months, just about have the key parts note for note, and they are spot on. Really, what more can you want out of life? There are a few books out there like this and some of Wolf Marshall's Stones transcriptions that are as close to an instruction manual on how to be a rock or blues god as you're going to get; the rest is up to you! Also, nice selection of songs. One critique would be the songs are mostly earlier Freddie, would love to find some tab of more of his 70's stuff.
