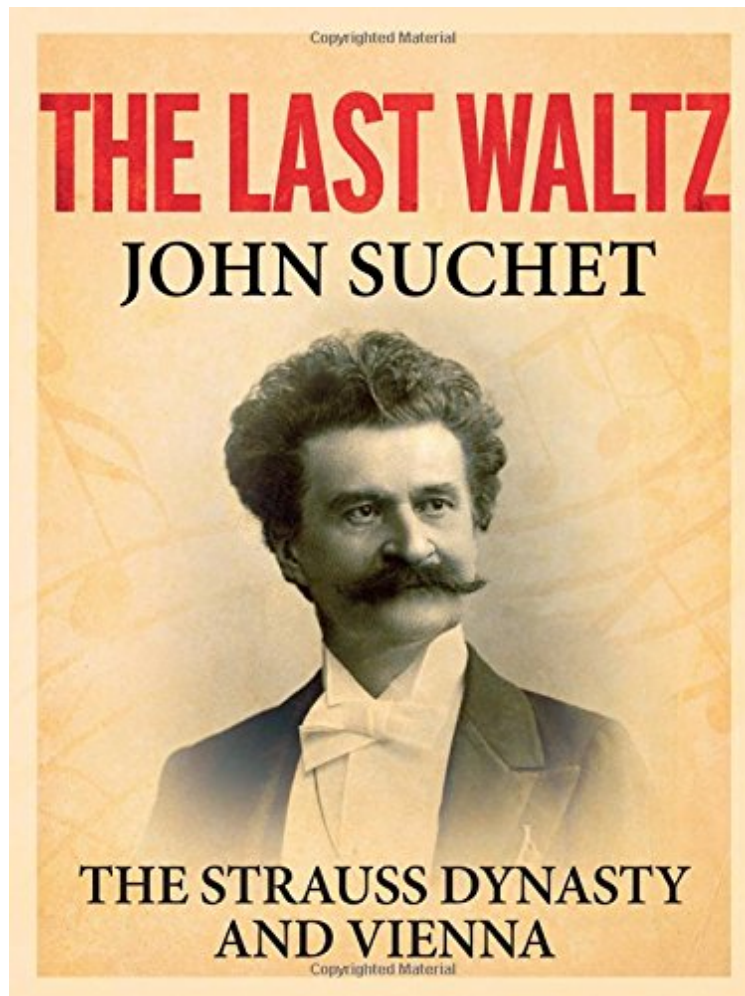

Johann and Josef Strauss, the Waltz Kings, composed hundreds of instantly recognizable and enduring melodies, including *The Blue Danube Waltz*, *Tales from the Vienna Woods*, *Voices of Spring* and *The Radetzky March*. Their iconic music has been featured on the scores of nearly a thousand films.
