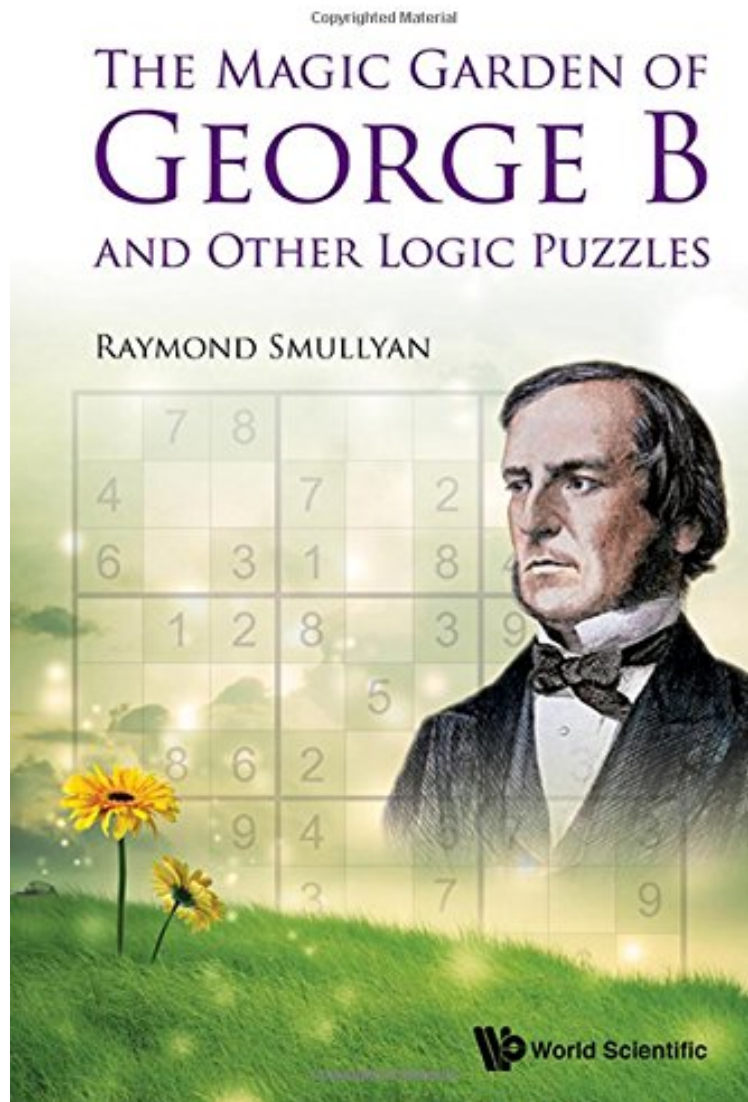

Dropped words (in one case rendering a puzzle unsolvable) plus errors in the formulae turned a pleasant read into a red pencil exercise in frustration. I hope Polimetrica takes better care when publishing future works.I sill would have bought the book because I enjoy Smullyan's other books, but I wish I had known this one would be rough around the edges. If you like Smullyan then by all means buy this, but if you are just being introduced please start with another book.
