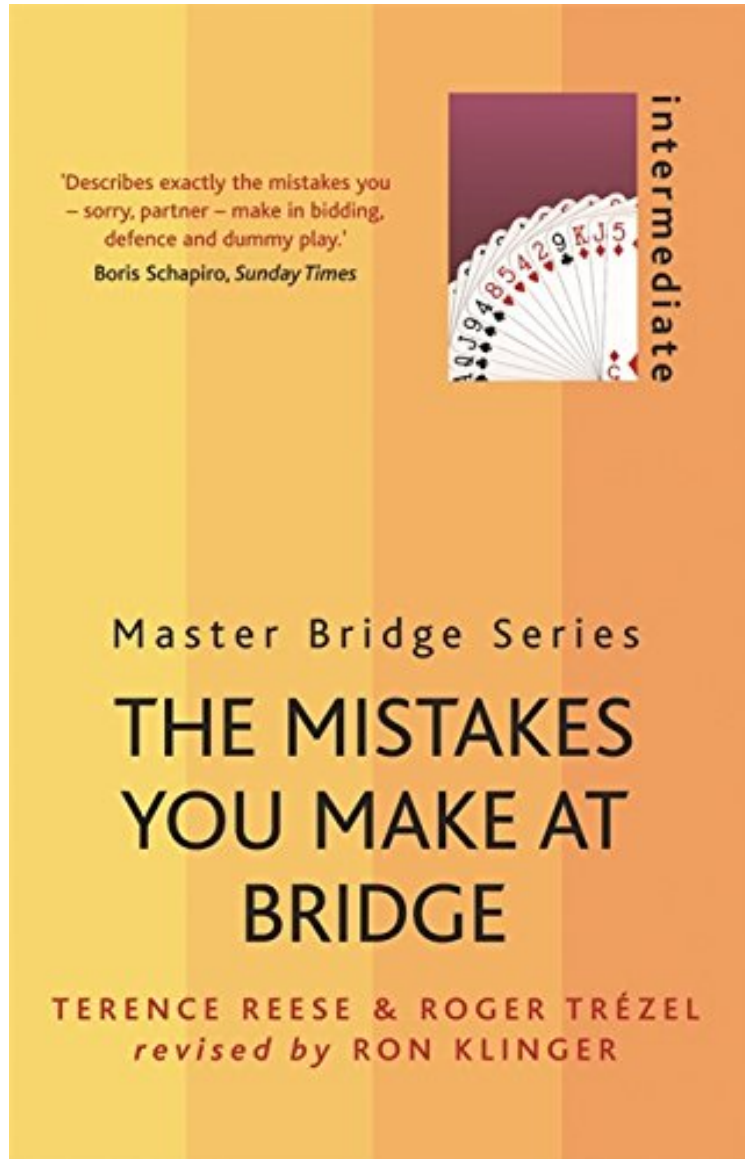

A good bookBy Jonathan CampbellI've had an earlier 1980s edition of this book for a few years now and I go back to it and reread it wholly or in part every once in awhile. It is organized very nicely by the severity of the mistakes (three categories from worst to most forgivable), and each category is

subdivided into bidding, declarer play, and defensive errors. Reese's clear, authoritative style is prevalent throughout so if you enjoy his writing you will enjoy this. One great thing about this book is that you don't have to commit to reading a lot of it at once; the "mistakes" are itemized and the material on each is fairly brief, often a page or less. As a whole it comprises a chamber of horrors of errors that you can actually see happening at the table all the time, and if you can learn to stop making some of them yourself you will gain an edge over your peers. 4 of 4 people found the following review helpful.
