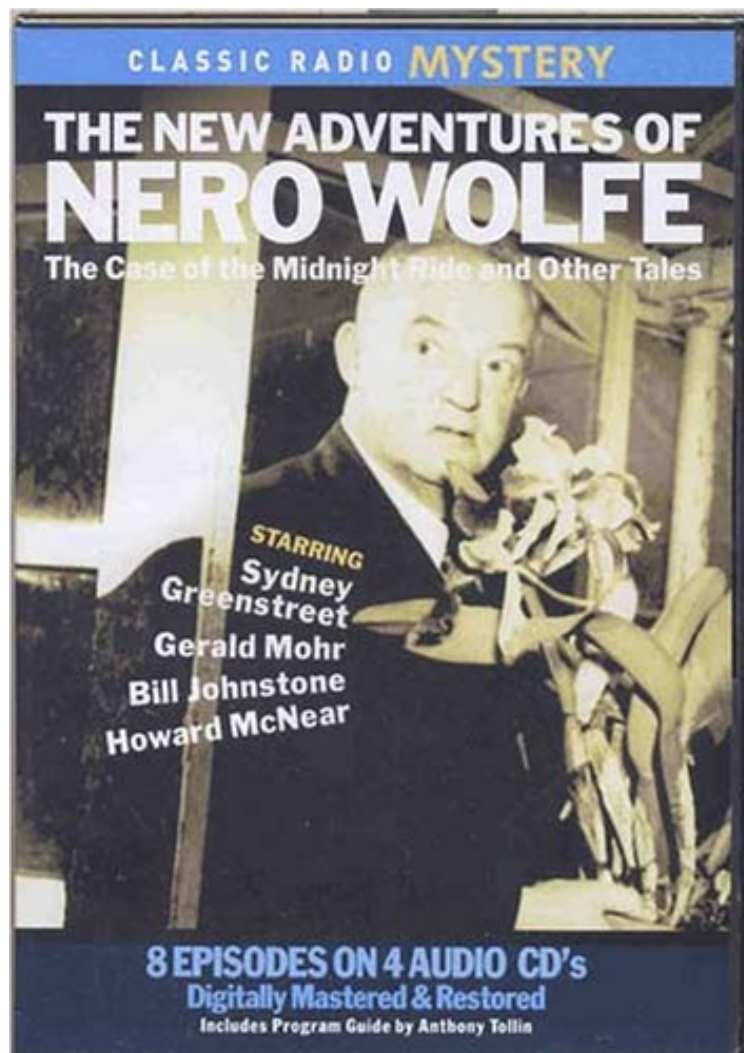

He is most widely known for his films with Humphrey Bogart and Peter Lorre, such as "The Maltese Falcon" and "Casablanca." Before his film debut, he mainly focused his talent on a wide range of stage performances, from musical comedies to Shakespeare. From 1950 to 1951 he played Nero Wolfe on the NBC radio program "The New Adventures of Nero Wolfe"Gerald Mohr (1914-1968) was a radio, stage, film, and television actor. With his striking resemblance to Humphrey Bogart, he was often cast in film noir roles. He is best known for his work in radio, primarily in The Whistler and The Adventures of Philip Marlowe. In 1949 Radio and Television Life magazine named Mohr as the Best Male Actor on Radio.Bill Johnson spent 52 years in the mining industry. Since his retirement, he has written many articles on mining as well as this book. He reached his 100th birthday in 2008 and lives with his wife, Dorothy, in Comox.
